

From the Pastor's Desk

"But those who are unwilling to learn (the catechism) should be told that they deny Christ and are no Christians, neither should they be admitted to the Sacrament, accepted as sponsors at baptism, nor exercise any part of Christian liberty, but should simply be turned back to the Pope and his officials, yea, to the devil himself. Moreover, their parents and employers should refuse them food and drink, and [they would also do well if they were to] notify them that the prince will drive such rude people from the country, etc."





September means back to school...and therefore a return to "learning." We're resuming Sunday school this month and our youth are starting up their Sunday Bible study again. Our confirmation program resumes, albeit in a different format than in the past. Every Wednesday evening at 5:30 P.M., we'll be holding a "Catechism Vespers" service. "Vespers" is the traditional order of Evening Prayer in the Church...and in place of a sermon, there will be a lesson on part of Luther's Small Catechism. These services will be open to those of any age who want to either prepare for confirmation in the Lutheran Church...or who simply want to be refreshed on the teachings of the Small Catechism.

Martin Luther had very harsh words for those who don't want to learn the Catechism (see above). When he says that "those who are unwilling to learn it should be told that they deny Christ and are no Christians," Luther isn't saying that a person is saved by memorizing a list of Bible verses and texts. He's saying that the idea that someone who has faith in Christ wouldn't desire to know Christian truth is incomprehensible.

Every Christian is called to *confess* his or her faith. The word "confess" literally means "to say the same thing." When we confess our faith, we join our voices to the Church throughout the world and throughout time in speaking about Jesus and what He has done for us and for everyone. Jesus says, "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (Matt. 10:32-33, ESV)

My hope and prayer is that these "Catechism Vespers" services will be a valuable tool in teaching not just our young people, but all of us to confess Jesus as Lord and to speak to others about the mighty work of God in saving us, His children. Please consider joining us every Wednesday at 5:30 P.M.!

Abortion pill dispensaries are on the increase following the Supreme Court's ruling in Dobbs overturning Roe v. Wade. Since that time, facilities offering chemical abortions also increased—and prescribers continue to flout approved FDA gestational limits. In addition, due to so-called shield laws, abortion pill prescribers and Honeybee Health pharmacy are threatening to ship the drugs into states that protect preborn children, while law enforcement ignores abortion pills flooding into the United States from unregulated, unapproved sources. In April of 2021, under the guise of the COVID-19 pandemic, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration expanded its safety regulations known as REMS to allow for limited mail-order pharmacy distribution ... the Biden FDA had further weakened the REMS by eliminating the in-person dispensing requirement and enabling the abortion pill to be permanently shipped by mail. Then, in January 2023, the Biden FDA further gutted the FDA's safety protocols on the drug by announcing it would allow retail pharmacies to dispense it. Today, abortion pill prescribers continue to flout the FDA's safety regulations by prescribing the pills well past the FDA-approved gestational limit, promoting unapproved protocols or veering away from FDA-approved rules by dispensing abortion pills to women who are not pregnant—and sometimes leaving women to deal with dangerous ectopic pregnancies on their own. LCMS- Stewardship-Ministry-Newsletter Article—SEPTEMBER Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment:

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bi-ble shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has no doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5–9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.
