

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"A voice cries: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." (Isaiah 40:3-6, ESV)

John the Baptist is the voice of the season of Advent...and the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy quoted above. He is the one who comes to prepare the way of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, the Savior of humanity.

And so we together embark on the season of Advent, hearing Isaiah and John's call to "prepare the way of the Lord." Both prophets call on us to remember that our God is not distant from His creation, but actively involved in it...even entering it in our own human flesh.

That may seem contrary to what our eyes and ears—and even, at times, our own hearts—tell us. We're so often overcome by a world where God seems absent. Evil seems to run rampant. Sin seems to run amok. The darkness of our fallen world can feel suffocating.

And so the seasons of Advent and Christmas are a beacon of light in that darkness. As the days grow shorter and the temperatures grow colder, the flames on the Advent wreath intensify in the light they give. On Christmas, the wreath gives its full light as we rejoice that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14) and our Savior from sin is found in Bethlehem's manger.

Along with the themes of light and God's coming among us, Advent calls us to repentance. Advent calls us to "make straight in the desert a highway for our God." We cast off the works of sin and darkness and turn to face the light of our coming Lord Jesus Christ.

As always, this Advent & Christmas season will provide multiple opportunities at Our Redeemer to hear the prophet's call to preparation. We invite you all to bask in the light of our coming Lord and join us at our Midweek Advent services and our three Christmas services (Christmas Eve, Christmas Midnight, and Christmas Day).



Every year, Lutherans For Life/Y4Life participates in the March for Life in Washington, D.C. On November 14, the March for Life Education and Defense Fund announced the theme for the 51st annual March for Life: "Pro-Life: With Every Woman, For Every Child." Since Roe v. Wade was first enacted, over 65 million lives have been lost to the horrors of abortion. Tragically, polling shows that many of these lives could have been saved if more women were aware of the vast network of pro-life resources across the nation that have lovingly supported women and children for over 50 years. "This year's theme is at the heart of the pro-life movement, but it is a story often untold," said Jeanne Mancini, President of the March for Life Education and Defense Fund. "For the past 51 years, the March for Life has powerfully witnessed to the tragedy of abortion while calling for stronger protections for women and the unborn. Yet nowhere is the beauty and importance of our work more powerfully embodied than in the day-to-day service of pregnancy support and maternity care organizations across the nation, which lovingly walk with women and their children, reminding them that they are never alone. This year's theme celebrates the heroic work of these organizations while offering a roadmap to how we will truly achieve a life-affirming culture that respects the inherent dignity of all human life." # **STEWARDSHIP**

# "The Measure of Our Generosity"

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?
